Who can apply?

- 1. Public and private research institutions
- 2. Private and public universities

What types of costs are eligible for funding?

Direct Costs

<u>Costs of personnel</u>: Grants towards the costs of administrators and/or student assistants required in connection with the proposed project can be provided.

<u>Costs of durable equipment</u>: Funding for equipment can be provided. However, this only includes equipment that does not form part of an institution's basic equipment (i.e. no laptops, notebooks or equipment which is regularly used by the applicants).

<u>Consumables and supplies</u>: Any consumables necessary for the project implementation (expendable items, devices, business needs, transportation expenses, literature, rents, orders, etc.) may be considered as direct costs. Consumables are only eligible costs if bought after the start date of the project. Consumables belonging to the basic facilities of an applicant are not eligible.

<u>Subcontracting</u>: The general rule is that applicants shall implement the project and shall have the necessary resources to that end. However, as an exception certain parts that are not "core" parts of the project may be subcontracted. Examples for minor services to be subcontracted are: rent of locations, translation costs, costs for technical equipment in the context of the organization of

events or printing services etc.

Other costs:

Events: With regard to workshops in Chile, funding may be provided for expenses such as catering, technical requirements and rental of the venue.

Travel and subsistence allowance: The subsistence allowance per full day (including accommodation, meals and local transport) in the context of a project trip should be applied as a lump sum of maximum €133 per day (CLP\$100.000) for a maximum of 30 days for domestic travelling. For international travelling the maximum is €150 per day (CLP\$112.500) for a maximum of 30 days. Travel costs are eligible in economy class only.

Upper funding limits for eligible costs?

The total project cost cannot exceed €80.000 per project (CLP\$60.000.000). This amount includes all participant institutions in Chile. Maximum CLP\$20.000.000.- per year.

Additional national eligibility criteria for the proposal beyond the general criteria in the Terms of Reference of the Joint Transnational Call:

- -Each Chilean partner applying for funds from CONICYT must include in its proposal a "Letter of Support" signed by the legal representative of their organization.
- -Projects with Chilean participation must have a duration of maximum 36 months.
- -Applicants from Chilean institutions and the legal representative of their institution whose full proposals have been granted will have to sign a formal contract with CONICYT in order to transfer the funds from CONICYT to the beneficiary. After this, the first transfer of fund from CONICYT is intended to be done during January-March 2019. Chilean beneficiaries will report funding directly to CONICYT according to the institutional requirements, which will be informed in the contract.
- -Projects including more than one Chilean institution will have to appoint one of them as principal national coordinator.
