Training sessions for Peruvian researchers

Workshop on the European Union's Horizon 2020 Programme

With the aim of continuing the dissemination process of the Horizon 2020 Program, materials were prepared and coordinated for the training sessions for Peruvian researchers provided by Claudia Romano, Coordinator of RedLAC NCP in the cities of Jaen - Cajamarca and Lima, Peru between December 11-13.

The workshop on Horizon 2020 was held together with the support of the Service Facility, CONCYTED and the Peruvian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, as well as its representation in Cajamarca and Jaen University.

In that workshop, the generalities, opportunities of participation in the last calls and the practical aspects of preparation and presentation of the proposals of the Horizon 2020 Programme were presented. Moreover, the participants developed proposals related to the calls.

The second day, which took place in Lima on December 13, was attended by 30 NCPs. As a result, a management commitment was made between them and CONCYTEC, where each one committed to at least one informative talk on the Horizon 2020 program per year and to participate in the dissemination of the calls.

On the 13th, there were also representatives of public and private institutions, universities and business chambers, among others, that attended the event. The highest authorities participated: Dr. Fabiola León Velarde, President of CONCYTEC; Diego Mellado, Ambassador of the European Union in Peru and Andrés Vicente Acosta Burga, Director of the Center for Higher National Studies.

This instance allowed the attendees to become familiar with Horizon 2020, as well as to learn about the open calls.

RISE Calls - Research and Innovation

We coordinated the last video conference of the year 2019, for which we invited the National Contact Points (NCP) of the MSCA in Spain: Cristina Gómez Corchete and Cristina Gracia Rodríguez. This last coordinator EURAXESS and both representatives of the Spanish Foundation for Science and Technology (FECYT).

It is important to us to close the year reporting on these actions since they opened on December 5 and close on April 28, 2020, so it is now essential to strengthen their dissemination. The results are shown in the attached document.

More than 80 people participated, including National Contact Points, researchers, university representatives, research centre representatives, and government representatives, among others. Among the countries we visualized were: Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Chile, Peru, Honduras, Panama, Costa Rica, Spain, Germany and Uruguay, among others. We understand that the same one was a great instance of closing of year, which generated many consultations that we understand derived in participations in the Actions Maria Skłodowska-Curie specifically in the modality RISE.

Krakow was a meeting place for the Net4Mobility+ Project

On 23-25 October, the training and coaching session with the National Contact Points of the Net4Mobility+ project partners took place in Krakow, Poland.

The aim is to exchange experience on the Marie Sklodowka Curie Actions (MSCA) and to have theoretical and practical elements to improve working skills.

Meeting of the Working Group on Research Infrastructures EU – CELAC

In the framework of the shared space between the European Union and CELAC, the fifth meeting of the Working Group on Research Infrastructures was held in Costa Rica. It was attended by senior authorities from CELAC countries working on science and technology issues and members of the European Commission.

It aimed to continue advancing efforts to develop a common European Union-CELAC research area, which focuses on three strategic pillars: mobility of researchers, access to research infrastructures and the joint solution of shared global challenges. In this instance, synergies will be sought with other areas working on the subject in different parts of the world, in order to avoid duplication of efforts and to contribute to the construction of the common area.

LAC NCP Network

What is it?

The Latin American and Caribbean National Contact Point Network (LAC NCP Network) comprises all National Contact Points officially designated by a State of CELAC through the highest authority in Science, Technology and Innovation and recognized by the European Commission through an official nomination.

What are your goals?

The **goal** of the LAC NCP Network is to promote and increase the participation of academia, companies and institutions in the Horizon 2020 Program in order to democratize the access to opportunities among the different countries of the region.

The aim is to create a more effective, dynamic, proactive and sustainable network in order to encourage a closer cooperation between all the national contact points in Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean.

Its **specific goals** are: reinforcing the designation and motivation of the NCPs in the CELAC region and improving these countries participation in H2020.

How does it work?

The NCPs are named for each of the thematic areas of the H2020 Program, as well as for cross-cutting areas. They are structured in the following way:


The inscriptions of the modality RISE opened to the public on December 5 of the current year and will close on April 28, 2020.
